We have had the addition of the Little Food Pantry on our church grounds for a year now :) And, its use has definitely been increasing as awareness of the LFP has grown. Prairie du Chien has several Little Free Libraries around town, but ours is the first Little Free Pantry for the community.

Recognizing how faithful members of St. Peter have been in donating to the CouleeCap Food Pantry, the Church in Society committee thought this 24/7 food pantry could be a successful addition for our ministries. This Little Free Pantry provides another opportunity for the St. Peter family to serve our neighbors! The LFP is there for anyone and everyone. Its mission statement, "Take what you need, leave what you can" is posted on its front door. Items that turn over quickly include facial tissues, toilet paper rolls, bars of soap, boxed food items, socks, hair products, personal hygiene items, fresh produce, canned fruit and seasonally appropriate donations. We decided to add the baskets and a cooler in order to be able to offer fresh produce, during the growing seasons. Keep in mind that some "shoppers" at the LFP, and CouleeCap, do not have a full kitchen or kitchen utensils. Canned

food items with pull-tab tops and can openers are helpful items to consider when making donations.

The Church in Society Committee would like to thank everyone for your ongoing support of the CouleeCap Food Pantry and our newest service to the community, our Little Free Pantry. As you may know, the CouleeCap Food Pantry provides monthly food distribution to Crawford County residents who meet certain eligibility criteria. Jann Sturmer, CouleeCap Bargain Boutique and Food Pantry Coordinator, also wishes to extend her appreciation for the years of support from the St. Peter congregation and would like folks to know that no one experiencing hunger will ever be turned away, whether a Crawford County resident or not. A list of suggested items can be found at the back of the sanctuary, next to the brown collection bins; the lists are relevant for both food pantry resources. There is a food pantry closet, located inside the carport entrance, with shelves labeled for both CouleeCap Food Pantry and LFP donations. Items for the LFP may also be dropped off either in the collection bins or placed directly in the LFP along Michigan St. Again, thank you for your generosity.
