Council Update

Hello St Peters members and guests,

This past Tuesday was the November council meeting. Most of the meeting was business as usual but there are several items that I wanted to mention. We normally have a financial report in the monthly newsletter. Last month's report caused several phone calls to me. The simplified report shows income and expenses, that is where we stand for the year. Last month's report also showed our investments that are tied to the stock market, with the stock market being down that figure caused some alarm. So in the future the financial report will not include the investment portion. The annual report will give a recap of the investments for the year. As of October 31st our expenses for 2022 are \$17,716 over our income for 2022, but we knew we would have more expenses due to having two fulltime Pastors. No reason to panic.

Now for some sad news, this past week Theresa submitted her retirement letter as our Admin Assistant. She plans on stepping down sometime in January. Theresa has been a huge asset to St Peter's over the past 4 years as we went from being without a Pastor, to hiring Pastor Miranda, Covid 19, working with countless Council, committee, and volunteer people, adding Pastor Hillary, and just day to day operations of St Peters. I cannot even begin to think of ways to thank her for her service and dedication to St Peters. If you get a chance, please thank her yourself. There will be more to follow as her retirement date approaches. In the next few weeks we will be advertising for her position so it you have an interest or know of someone who would be a good fit, please let us know.

My last day will be July 16, 2023 after which my resignation will be in full effect. Words will never fully be able to express our gratitude for the relationships and memories we've made while in service here and with each and every one of you. Ukrainian Women Need our Help!

Earlier this year, the Hungry Jar collected cash to assist refugees, mostly women and children fleeing the wartorn country of Ukraine. Pastor Kyle and Anna Svennungsen, our ELCA missionaries in Bratislava are part of the team which maintains a refugee shelter at the city's main train station. We now have learned that there is a severe need for the many adult women who have remained in Ukraine. They are without winter apparel. The Ukraine winters are much like the season here in Wisconsin. Temperatures dip to freezing and snow covers the landscapes.

Rather than conduct a coat or mitten drive and ship the donations abroad, it is more efficient to collect cash and transfer these funds to an individual in Ukraine. This person is mounting the drive on behalf of the people of Ukraine. This is the plan the Church in Society committee is adopting.

If you are able to make a monetary donation to help get warm winter coats for the Ukrainian women in need, please write a check to St. Peter Lutheran Church with the phrase Ukraine coats in the memo. We have a target date of December 16 as our deadline to enable the funds raised to be transferred before the Christmas holiday. Thank you for your consideration of this important project.
