Update from Pastor Miranda on the first portion of her Sabbatical

Greetings St. Peter Church Family,

It is a joy to be back connecting with you and worshipping with you following this first larger portion of Sabbatical. I thank God for this extended time for learning, spiritual renewal, connection with God, rest, and dwelling in the love of Jesus in the midst of our ministry together as pastor and people. I am excited to be with you, learning from you and serving with you, and engaging in mission and ministry alongside you!

Some highlights of these first weeks of Sabbatical include:

- Participating in the Festival of Homiletics- a preaching conference where I was able to listen to some powerful sermons and speakers on the topic of preaching. The theme was "Preaching to Heal the Divide".
- Retreat days at Sugar Creek Bible Camp- our family stayed in a cabin at Sugar Creek for two of the weeks.
 The boys had fun with full-day camp programs; while I had spiritual retreat days for prayer, reflection, and reading books on theology and spiritual renewal.
- A Family Camp led by two MN pastors, where my boys and I were able to learn, worship, and play alongside
 other families in Christian community. The theme of the week was "Ready, Set, Move" from Acts 17:28 "For in
 God we live and move and have our being."
- Extended intentional conversations with spiritual mentors and friends.
- It was a joy to worship in the pew with my family, helping my own young boys to engage with worship and follow along with the service. A few highlights included: worshipping with the congregation that helped to form my faith as a child and teenager, First Lutheran Church in Cedar Rapids, IA; worshipping with my "home congregation" of my young adult years, Our Redeemer Lutheran Church in St. Paul, MN, which was my church family for ten years while I lived in the Twin Cities; and worshipping at Jesse's home congregation of Bethany Lutheran Church in Elkader, IA, where his dad served as a pastor for 29 years.
- A particularly meaningful time of Sabbatical was going on long prayer walks with God. These ½ day hikes were wonderful times of being able to renew my own relationship with God, as a child of God, in the midst of God's beautiful creation. This included exploring some "new-to-me" local trails as a part of the 75th Anniversary Hiking Challenge at Effigy Mounds National Monument. A Bible verse that was central to these prayer hikes was from Psalm 62:1-2 "For God alone my soul waits in silence; from him comes my salvation. He alone is my rock and my salvation, my fortress; I shall never be shaken."
- Additional learning experiences were: continuing ICF Coaching Training through Vibrant Faith (as a part of a Siebert Grant for continuing education that I received) and engaging with Faith + Lead church ministry leadership resources, including their Pivot podcast.
- This was the largest portion of the Sabbatical: July 14-September 14. There will be five additional special
 weeks coming later in 2025 and early 2026 (which include one week of vacation) to total 3 months of Sabbatical learning and renewal experiences.

Thank you! As we move together into fall ministries, I am glad to carry these enriching experiences with me as we engage in worship, learning, discipleship, and service together. There is a lot to look forward to- Outdoor Worship, Confirmation Sunday, the start of Choir, All Saints Worship, Youth Ministry events, new ideas from the Engaging Children's Initiative, and planning for mission in 2026 (check inside this newsletter for lots of ways to be involved.)

I'm glad to be in partnership with you as a fellow disciple in this amazing church family!



Sunday Morning Discipleship Discussion for Youth and Adults: Sundays at 10:20 a.m.



A Message from Council President Mike McCoy

Once a month, I pack up my guitar and ukulele and travel to my one and only music gig. I make the long, four-block journey to the Prairie Assisted Living Center and share a few songs with the kind residents there.

The playlist changes slightly each month, but there are always a handful of songs that are featured every time. I start with one of my dad's favorites: "The Wabash Cannonball." It's a great warm-up song and sets the tone. "King of the Road" is a must and "Good Night Irene" is a wonderful sing-a-long. Eventually, I pull out my ukulele and strum a few uke standards, "Five Foot Two, Eyes of Blue" and "Side by Side" followed by a rousing version of "Hey Good Lookin'." At the end, I always jokingly tell the residents to put on their cowboy hats. The guys are Roy Rogers and they hop on ol' Trigger while the ladies, Dale Evans of course, saddle up on Buttermilk. We all ride off into the sunset as we sing "Happy Trails."

I always hope I include a few favorites for everyone who attends. I am confident that there are at least two songs that most residents hold dearly: "The Old Rugged Cross" and "Amazing Grace." When we sing those songs together, I look around the room. Oftentimes, I see the residents with their eyes closed, heads tilted slightly back as they sing along or just quietly mouth the words. There is something comforting about those old hymns.

For the past several months, our worship services have included favorite hymns submitted by congregational members. Thanks to the Music and Worship committee for that wonderful idea. There have been a few contemporary songs, but most are the familiar hymns we have sung all our church lives. It's almost like a "Hymnal Greatest Hits" album...or 8 track...or cassette...or CD.

I often end my day with a collection of these same songs. Many nights when I crawl into bed (usually a couple hours before my wife), I politely ask Alexa to play, "Piano hymn music for 30 minutes." The playlist is all instrumental music, and the songs are both familiar and comforting. It helps me clear my mind. I find it remarkable how the first song played is always my favorite for that particular night, usually because I'm asleep before the second one starts.
